Pack 216 - Organization

 The Pack is all of the youth (grades K-5) and their adult leaders

 The Pack meets once a month for a fun meeting (Pack meeting)



Dens

- The Pack is divided into "Dens" by grade
 & gender, Dens meet 2-3 times a month.
 - Lions (Kindergarten)
 - Tiger (1st grade)
 - Wolf (2nd grade)
 - Bear (3rd grade)
 - Webelos (4th grade)
 - Arrow of Lights (5th grade)



- All Scout Activities are age-appropriate
- 4th and 5th graders are transitioning to Troop organization which is different than the Pack structure.



Volunteers

- Parents make Scouting go!
- Cub Scouts is designed to help parents spend time with their child
- Parents participate with their child
- Parents are the major source of pack leadership (plan events, run den meetings)



Training for Volunteers

- Online & In-Person Training is offered to ensure a quality program and to keep our youth safe

BSA National & Unit Fees


Annual Registration Fees

- \$10 a month, paid annually (\$120)
- Scout's Life Magazine is \$15
- Pack Dues are \$ 75.00 *subject to change annually based on Pack Calendar

Make checks payable to <u>"Pack 216"</u>
There will be additional costs for campouts, uniforms etc.

- Scout's Life is \$15 a year and delivered to your child



What do my Fees Cover

Fees at National Level Cover General Liability Insurance, background safety checks and administrative costs.

• \$40.00 of your National fees go back to your local Council to cover program costs. (Programs such as Cub Haunted and Cub Adventure Weekend are in part funded by this.)



Annual Unit Dues

Your Annual Unit Dues pay for program needs. Items include:

- Advancements
- Pinewood Derby Kits
- Regatta Kits
- Awards, Patches, Certificates
- Subsidies on Camping trips or help with Pack meals on outings.
- Additional assets such as software upgrades or website fees needed to help the Pack Go!



How the Pack funds itself

Pack dues

- Annual fundraisers
 - Popcorn Sales
 - Camp Card Sales
 - Any other fundraisers



Pack 216's Annual budget is around \$4,000 annually, not including recharter



Annual Popcorn Fundraiser

- Scouts will learn to help pay their way.
- Popcorn sales are level based for the unit.
- Each Scout earns points towards their own gift cards.
- The Pack keeps approximately 30% of all sales and an additional 2% if level requirements are met by leadership.

Pack Parent Expectations


- Any Smoking, tobacco or vape products are prohibited.

- Use of colorful language prohibited.
- All Parents should take Youth Protection Training online at my.scouting.org
- All Parents MUST cover the "Parents Guides to Protecting Your Children From Child Abuse" found in each handbook annually.
- Be engaged with your child at each event and at home.
 There are requirements that must be done at home, not in meetings. Show up for as many scouting opportunities as possible. Help your child with their advancements.

What will my Scout be doing?



Each Scout works from a handbook to earn achievements and electives towards their end of year rank. These important adventures impart critical safety, character, and life skill through iterative learning year over year.

- Your Child will participate in Adventures outlined in their handbook at both Den meetings and at Home.
- Many of the Adventures are fun while teaching through incidental learning.
- Parents will help their scout in meetings and outings to accomplish their end of year rank.
- Parents will log their child's advancements completed at Home in Scoutbook.






Scouting App




- The Scouting App (red) allows you to track your Scout's rank progress, advancements, and awards.
- You will use the Scouting App to log any adventure requirements that your Scout completes outside of den meetings or other organized pack or den activities.
 Requirements completed at den meetings and pack or den activities will be logged by den leaders.
- The Scouting App interfaces with BSA's national record keeping program, "Scoutbook". You have the option of accessing Scoutbook directly at Scoutbook.scouting.org.
